A Moment with Pastor Mike

Our Lenten journey continues, with our Wednesday evening Lenten Bible studies from John's gospel, the Prayer Journey at Our Lady of the Snows shrine on April 5, our Palm Sunday service April 13, Maundy Thursday service on April 17, and 24-hour prayer vigil on April 18-19, all leading up to Easter, and the joyful proclamation of Christ's victory over death.



Yes, Easter's coming—and with it, thoughts of death and new life, new beginnings, new hope. Easter also brings to me memories of baptism. I remember my own baptism on Easter Sunday 1956 in Ottumwa, Iowa, that sudden plunge into the water and splashing my way back on my feet, feeling pleased at my new commitment, my new faith. I remember the many baptisms I have participated in as a pastor, at Easter and other times of year. I remember the baptisms of my own children.

At different times, I have been in groups where people have shared their baptismal memories. Not very many had great spiritual experiences at the time, but for each of us it was a significant memory, a significant milepost of our Christian lives. That step into the water was the first step in our lives as confessed, committed Christians. We had loved Jesus before, but were now officially welcomed into the family. We had heard about Jesus dying and coming back to life before, but now we had experienced a little death in going under the water, and a beginning of new life as we came back up.

Blanket Sunday



Week of Compassion Update

"Aren't we supposed to be turning water into wine? Isn't it the other way around?" This was a common question asked by several of those introduced to the concept of turning wine into water. As the twenty/ thirty-something pastors shared about the idea of a fun evening out with friends tasting wine while making a difference in our world, people were skeptical--at first. The more people learned about the event, the more people were fascinated and excited to be a part.

Four Disciples churches in the Springfield, MO area (Brentwood Christian Church, Central Christian Church, National Avenue Christian Church, and South Street Christian Church) came together to sponsor a wine tasting event and silent auction. The hope of the churches was to promote community and support global water projects through the work of Week of Compassion. The vision of the pastors was to pull together resources, the strengths and talents of congregations, and stand together to support this important cause.

While preparing for the event, the clergy shared information concerning water issues with their

congregations and the wider community. People had the opportunity to learn about wells, cisterns, sand dams, clean water delivery and hygiene systems in East Africa. Clean water projects make a difference in communities and the lives of individuals. They celebrated and gave thanks for the work Week of Compassion and their partnerships, especially

Communications Ministries keeps our Disciples community informed and promotes our General Assemblies, where we all gather together.


Disciples Historical Society preserves and shares the special story of our unique history and interconnects all Stone Campbell churches all around the world.
